## Day 1: Welcome Ceremony



On Wednesday November 4, 2015, scholars visited Shanghai educational resource center and Library. Before conference scholars visited the digital lab of open learning. They are working on classroom learning space by involving 3D virtual reality, augmented reality, learning screen, interactive learning screen and spectra vision. They also demonstrated their research work on network-based learning space which involves game-based learning. They also presented their work on learning analytics which are used for improving instructional design.

On the afternoon of Nov.4th 2015, the International Conference with the theme "The Capacity Building of Open Universities in the Globalization Era" was successfully held at the main campus of SOU. The conference was co-organized by Shanghai Open University and UNESCO UNITWIN Network in Distance and Open Learning. More than 200 participants from 13 countries of Europe, Asia, and Africa attended the conference.



The conference focused on the exploration of educational reforms and the latest achievement in online distance education of SOU. Participants shared their prior experience and shared their views and thoughts about MOOCs, flipped classroom, building capacity of staff in research through open and distance education, learning support services, and management services, etc.

After meeting with School of Public Administration, a seminar was arranged which was chaired by Prof. Remond Emilie. Key points focused by Mrs. Pauline Ernest from Spain are given as below:

- Teacher's training is more important than student's training
- For online teaching, training for teachers MUST be online using same platform
- Timing is very important, it MUST be just before they start teaching
- Teacher's training should be rigorous not a formality
- Teacher's MUST give IMMEDIATE feedback/response to students on online platforms
- For audio activity of student, feedback should be in same audio format
- For video activity of student, feedback should be in same video format

## **Day 8: Seminar on Quality Assurance**

On Wednesday November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2015, seminar on Quality Assurance was arranged. This seminar was chaired by Dr. Peter Rosmalen and presented by Dr. Daniel and Dr. Wai Wai. According to Dr. Daniel, standards are dynamic and quality is about continuous improvement to achieve the set standards at any one time. AIOU can collaborate with Zambian Open University to improve and work on Quality Assurance of both institutes.








Figure 13: Presentations on Quality Assurance
